LANE RESTRICTIONS & ROAD CLOSURE

Restricted lane closures under traffic lights on Brickendon lane from, Monday 6th until Sunday 12th February, followed by a 8 week full road closure from Monday 13th February until Tuesday 4th April. An appropriate approved traffic diversion will be put in place. This will be followed by another period of restricted lane closures under traffic lights from Wednesday 5th April 2017 to Tuesday 18th April 2017.

The closures provided will allow us to safely and efficiently carry out essential works to the retaining structure which supports the road near to the Tun Abdul Razak Research Centre. (TARRC)

What are we doing?

- Removing and replacing the retaining wall to ensure stability of the carriageway embankment and to ensure this structure remains suitable for use for approximately 120 more years without major maintenance.

Dates & Times

The works will commence with a restricted Lane closure under traffic lights, on Monday 6th February 2017 until Sunday 12th February.

From Monday 13th February there will be a 24 hour road closure on Brickendon Lane until 4th April 2017 and then following will be a restricted lane closure under traffic lights from 5th April until 18th April 2017

How will this affect you?

The works involve installation of a new sheet- piled retaining wall and demolition of the existing structure. We will be making every effort to keep any noise to a minimum, however unfortunately due to the nature of the works some noise will be unavoidable.

We will endeavour to maintain access for pedestrian at all times during works operations.

What are we asking you to do?

We appreciate your patience and will endeavour to keep any disruption to an absolute minimum and complete these works as quickly as possible. We apologise for any inconvenience that this may cause and appreciate your co-operation whilst these works are in progress

Additional Information

- This work is weather dependent and from time to time unforeseen circumstances arise, any changes to the proposed start date, duration or working hours will be notified on the information boards at either end of your street. This information will also be made available on our website www.hertsdirect.org/roadworks which can be accessed by scanning the QR code on this letter.
